## **Assembly Speaker Joseph Roberts, Jr. Will Not Seek Re-election**

Assembly Speaker Joseph J. Roberts, Jr. announced today that he will not seek re-election to the Assembly this November. Roberts announced his decision to his South Jersey colleagues at a breakfast meeting in Cherry Hill this morning followed by a press conference in the State House this afternoon.

Roberts has served as Speaker since 2006 and served as Majority Leader from 2002 to 2006. He was first elected to the Assembly in a special election on July 28, 1987 and was re-elected eleven times. Prior to joining the Assembly, Roberts served on the Camden County Board of Chosen Freeholders from 1980 through 1987, and was freeholder director for four of those years. He also served on the Bellmawr Borough Council and Board of Education.

Roberts' replacement on November's ballot is expected to be Donald Norcross, President of the Southern New Jersey AFL-CIO Central Labor Council. Norcross is also co-chairman of the Camden County Democratic Committee and the brother of South Jersey political boss George Norcross.
